- Our schools continue to play a vital role in collecting and distributing food parcels to their communities.
- The Trust has setup a connected charity, the 4 All Foundation to support our communities.

### Action / Aim **Time Frame** Our community coming to Shrewsbury Academy Commit to fundraising and charity events within the local community. Giving opportunities from local charities to come in and present to students their aims and ideals. 2024 - onwards Students can the nominate where fundraising totals are sent. Charities will be invited to our fundraising events. Local businesses to be given the opportunity to sponsor or take part in school events, such as a Christmas Fayre. 2024 - onwards Members of the community invited to all events to enable us opportunity to thank the community for their support. Continue to build strong links with post-16 providers in the community, including colleges and local businesses with provision for apprenticeships. These also support our KS4 2023 - onwards cohort with CV writing and college mock-interviews preparing them for the real-life situations they will follow. The Academy will continue to host events with Primary links such as the Dance Festival. We will continue to develop these 2022 - onwards links and host further Primary liaison events where parents can be involved to build our transitional bonds. Continue to host coffee mornings for families within our community based around both fundraising, such as the Macmillan coffee mornings, and community liaison. Students to work with the school team to provide decorations, 2022 - onwards refreshments and entertainment for these events. This will encourage students to build positive interactions within the community.

### Going out into our community

All Year 10 students will attend a work experience placement, the vast majority will be within our local community. After the impact of the pandemic on this type of event, we are excited to grow this back to a week's worth of experiences. This is a fantastic opportunity for all students to be out in the community and developing future skills.	2022 - onwards
Continue to develop creative links with our community such as the carolling for local old age pensioners at Christmas. Students to be growing these links throughout the year and developing positive interactions across many vulnerable groups within our wider community.	2023 - onwards

#### **KS4 Mock Interviews**

Tilbury Douglas have been working with us on preparing our Year 10 and Year 11 students for their next steps. This year we had a phenomenal event which really helped students to prepare for their forthcoming college interviews. Every member of Year 10 received a one-to-one interview and then had personal feedback shared.Students were really pleased with the activity and gained lots of useful knowledge to prepare them for the real thing.

#### **Dance Festival**

The Primary dance festival happens every year during our summer term. It's a great opportunity for pupils from our Primary Schools to visit us and take part in such an exciting and powerful event. This year we had performance from, performances from: HJS, Mount Pleasant and Shrewsbury Cathedral showing work they have done with our Dance teacher. They were also joined by our KS3 Dance group.

#### **Christmas Carols**

As part of our Christmas celebrations we visited Montgomery House a part of the Coverage Care group, where a group of students sang a mixture of popular and traditional Christmas songs for the community at the Care Home. In addition to this a carol concert was held for families and the wider community in our main school hall which was a sold-out event.
