We are very keen to promote a culture of reading within the school for very well documented reasons. Research strongly supports the idea that reading helps children engage in all curriculum areas. Here are some key findings:

- 1. Improved Academic Performance: Studies have shown that students who read independently tend to perform better academically. They score higher on achievement tests across various subjects and have greater content knowledge¹.
- 2. Enhanced Comprehension Skills: Foundational reading skills, such as phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, and comprehension, are crucial. These skills not only improve reading ability but also enhance understanding in other subjects².
- 3. Cross-Disciplinary Benefits: Integrating literacy instruction into all content areas enriches the curriculum. Students learn to use literacy for different purposes, which helps them understand and engage with material in subjects like science, math, and social studies³.
- 4. Lifelong Learning: Encouraging reading from an early age fosters a love for learning. This habit can lead to continuous self-education and curiosity, benefiting students throughout their academic careers and beyond4.

Early next year we look forward to opening the brand-new Library area in school. Please join us in encouraging reading and maybe help finding a book that might begin a positive change. I am reading Darragh Ennis's new book (one of ITV's Chasers) The body: 10 things you should know. Its fascinating, quite short and good fun to read. Perhaps a thought for a Christmas Gift?

Shrewsbury Academy Spotlight - What is Autism and how does it impact learning?

Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) is a neurodevelopmental condition that affects how individuals perceive and interact with the world. It is characterised by challenges in social interactions, communication, and repetitive behaviours. The term spectrum" indicates the wide range of symptoms and severity that individuals with autism can experience.

How Autism can affect Learning

- 1. Social Skills: Autistic children may find it difficult to understand social cues, which can impact their interactions with peers and teachers.
- Communication: Many autistic children face challenges with verbal and non-verbal communication, making it hard to express needs or understand instructions.
- Sensory Processing: Sensory sensitivities can make certain environments overwhelming, affecting concentration and participation.
- Information Processing: Autistic children might process information differently, often requiring more time to understand and respond.
- 5. Anxiety: Higher levels of anxiety can interfere with learning by making it hard to focus and stay organised.

Adapting Teaching Methods for Autistic Children

- Structured Environment: Clear routines and structured environments help autistic children feel secure and understand what to expect.
- Visual Supports: Using visual aids like schedules, charts, and picture cards can help autistic students understand and follow instructions.
- Incorporate Interests: Leveraging a child's special interests can make learning more engaging and meaningful.
- Sensory Tools: Providing sensory tools like fidget toys or noise-cancelling headphones can help manage sensory sensitivities.
- Social Skills Training: Structured activities that promote social interaction can help develop these crucial skills.
- Clear and Simple Instructions: Keeping instructions short and clear can help autistic students understand and follow them more easily.
- Positive Reinforcement: Encouraging and rewarding positive behaviour can motivate autistic children and reinforce learning.

By understanding the unique needs of autistic students and adapting teaching methods accordingly, our teachers can create a supportive and effective learning environment that helps these students thrive.
