Dear Families

I thought it would be timely to outline some of the changes that have seen improvement within school since Ofsted arrived in January 2024.

Curriculum and Teaching Improvements: The school has restructured its curriculum to be more ambitious and better aligned with the key knowledge students need to succeed. This restructuring aims to address gaps in student learning and ensure a more consistent educational experience. Teachers are working on refining their methods to better identify and address these gaps.

Behaviour and Attitudes: There have been positive changes in the school's approach to behaviour management. New routines and clearer expectations have been introduced, leading to better behaviour in many areas of the school.

Support for Students: The school has made strides in supporting pupils and specifically pupils who struggle with reading.

Efforts are being made to accurately identify the needs of these students and provide appropriate interventions. The effectiveness of these interventions has improved, and the school is working on ensuring that all pupils receive the support they need.

Leadership and Management: Leadership at Shrewsbury Academy is focused on realising the Trust's mission of "achievement through caring". Staff are dedicated to creating a supportive environment, and there is a clear ambition for all pupils to succeed. GCSE outcomes have shifted significantly, there has been a tremendous improvement here, SA has made more improvement than any other local school.

We are committed to making further improvements, but it is fair to say standards are improving significantly.

Science Required Practicals

GCSE science practical's are experiments that help students develop practical skills and knowledge. They often involve using specific equipment and techniques. Questions about required practicals frequently feature in GCSE exams. Here are Year 10 completing the biology required practical investigating the optimal pH for the enzyme amylase. Amylase is found in saliva and helps break down starch, a carbohydrate found in foods like rice and potatoes into simpler sugars. This explains why bread and pasta start to taste sweet after we have chewed them for a while and mixed them with our saliva. These will be the last round of GCSE practicals completed before the Science team occupy their new purpose built Science labs opening after the Easter Break, I think everyone is excited about this!




Attendance Matters
